Day 1 and 2 were primarily travel days, flying from the US into Guatemala City and getting settled into Hotel Barcelo on Saturday, then a three-hour ride to Chichicastenango and Hotel Santo Tomas on Sunday morning. We enjoyed a late lunch, a stroll through the market and worship with the Chichi church that evening.

Monday, day three, we traveled to Paxot Tercero, our mobile clinic home for the next two days.

Health Talents nurse, Ottoniel has been trained as a hygienist and he in turn trained Morgan. Observing first, then gaining enough confidence to begin applying fluoride, basically painting the teeth with a cotton swab. Morgan soon advanced to 'polishing' and graduated to use the cavitrons before the end of the week.

On Thursday, we gave one young man a choice...the male hygienist from Guatemala, or the red-heading female in training from Arkansas. He chose wisely, grinning broadly...the sweet redhead!



Meghan Hickerson, an RN from Ohio, and graduate of Harding's Carr College of Nursing was making her first trip to Guatemala, a two-week stint as she traveled to Clinica Ezell Hospital at weeks' end to join the Eye/Ortho surgical team.
